
A Day for Prayer

Today (May 5) is National Day of Prayer, the 60th annual observance of this important event in the life of our country. Its theme is *A Mighty Fortress Is Our God*, based on Psalm 91:2, which states, "I will say of the Lord, He is my refuge and my fortress, my God, in whom I trust."



The National Day of Prayer tradition predates the founding of the United States of America, evidenced by the Continental Congress' proclamation in 1775 setting aside a day of prayer. In 1952, Congress established an annual day of prayer and, in 1988, that law was amended, designating the National Day of Prayer as the first Thursday in May.

Shirley Dobson, chairman of the National Day of Prayer Task Force, said believers in God should "labor throughout the year to communicate the pressing need for God's people to unite in repentance and corporate intercession for the sake of our beleaguered country. We continue to face unabated moral decline, economic turmoil, military conflict in the Middle East, and ever-increasing

assaults against our religious liberty. Given these urgent concerns, it's imperative that we remain on our knees in contrite supplication for the United States."

As we thank Him for His grace and providence, we should fervently seek His direction and His wisdom in the mission to which we have been called.
