Jim Rowlett is chaplain of the National Street Rod Association and the Lone Star Street Rod Association. The logo for his ministry features a 1932 Ford Highboy with a cross above it and the Scripture verse Matthew 16:26 between the two.

The verse states: "For what is a man profited, if he shall gain the whole world, and lose his own soul? Or what shall a man give in exchange for his soul?"

Rowlett said many have asked why the Scripture reference is used. "While it seems self-explanatory, people don't always realize how easy it is to put 'things' ahead of God. It became very obvious to me, after the construction of our chopped 1938 Chevrolet Sedan, that I had allowed the vehicle to take priority in my life. The goal of having a vehicle that was worthy of attention consumed my time and attention. I thank God that the obsession did not continue to dominate my world. I've learned to keep the cross above the car!"



Rowlett also poses a series of questions:

- What if God couldn't take the time to bless us today because we couldn't take the time to thank Him yesterday?
- What if God decided to stop leading us tomorrow because we didn't follow Him today?
- What if we never saw another flower bloom because we grumbled when God sent the rain?
- What if God didn't walk with us today because we failed to recognize it as His day?
- What if God took away His message because we failed to listen to His messenger?
- What if God didn't send His only begotten Son because He wanted us to be prepared to pay the price for sin?
- What if the church was closed because we didn't open the door to our hearts?
- What if God stopped loving and caring for us because we failed to love and care for others?
- What if God would not hear us today because we would not listen to Him yesterday?
- What if God answered our prayers the way we answer His call to service?
- What if God met our needs the way we give Him our lives?
