Automobile pioneer Henry Ford once said something quite encouraging for those who may not feel appreciated.



He was speaking about his car, the Model T, all of which came in the same color and style. His words still ring true today. He said:

“All Fords are exactly alike, but no two people are just alike. Every new life is a new thing under the sun; there has never been anything just like it before, and never will be again.

A young person ought to get that idea about himself; he should look for the single spark of individuality that makes him different from other folks and develop that for all he’s worth. Society and schools may try to iron it out of him; their tendency is to put us all in the same mold, but I say, ‘Don’t let that spark be lost; it’s your only real claim to importance.’”
