It's hard to believe that it has been seven years since we added the words *And Then Some* to our Whatever It Takes customer service recognition program. The redesigned materials were shipped to our centers across the country in the fall of 2005.

The impetus for including that phrase came from a sermon by Dr. Hays Wicker, pastor of First Baptist Church of Naples, Fla., capturing the attention of Forrest Preston. Preston immediately thought of its application to Life Care and our dedication to our residents. Dr. Wicker told this story:

A very rich man from the Rio Grande Valley in Texas was asked by a reporter about the secret of his success. His response was: "I don't need many words to tell you, just three – And Then Some."

The wealthy man explained, "I have always tried to do what is expected of me, and then some. In other words, to do more, to go the second mile. That is the secret of success in any area of life."
