Charles Schulz, the wonderfully talented creator of the comic strip *Peanuts*, was a man who earned the respect and admiration of people around the world. He died on February 12, 2000, but his works are a powerful legacy, and they will endure for generations to come. How did you do? The point is: None of us remembers the headliners of yesterday. These are not second-rate achievers. They are the best in their fields. But the applause dies. Awards tarnish. Achievements are forgotten. Accolades and certificates are buried with their owners.

Here is another quiz. See how you do on this one.

- 1. List a few teachers who aided your journey through school.
- 2. Name three friends who have helped you through a difficult time.
- 3. Name five people who have taught you something worthwhile.
- 4. Think of a few people who have made you feel appreciated and special.
- 5. Think of five people with whom you enjoy spending time.
