Command on the River


Whitewater rafting on the Ocoee River in nearby Polk County has become one of Southeast Tennessee's biggest draws for tourists. It attracted worldwide attention in 1996 when this river was chosen for the whitewater competition of the Atlanta Olympics. Shooting the rapids is exciting but tiring. When it's obvious that everyone needs a break, the guide says, "Eddy out!"
