At the awards presentation, he gave a brilliant, heartfelt speech thanking everyone who helped him get to where he was. The best moment came when he talked about his mother, who was sitting in the front row. Here is what he had to say to her:

I don't think you know what you did. You had my brother when you were 18 years old. Three years later, I came out. The odds were stacked against you. Single parent with two boys by the time you were 21 years old.

Everybody told us we weren't supposed to be here. We moved from apartment to apartment by ourselves. One of the best



memories I have is when we moved into our first apartment. No bed, no furniture, and we just all sat in the living room and hugged each other because we thought we made it.

When something good happens to you, I don't know about you guys, but I tend to look back to what brought me here. You woke me up in the middle of the night in the summer times. Making me run up a hill. Making me do pushups. Screaming at me from the sidelines at my games at 8 or 9 years old.

We weren't supposed to be here. You made us believe. You kept us off the street, put clothes on our backs, food on the table. When you didn't eat, you made sure we ate. You went to sleep hungry. You sacrificed for us. You're the real MVP.

Isn't it true that any real success we experience in our lives is due to the sacrifices of someone else? For most of us – and certainly for me – that someone else was Mama.
