Finding Diamonds in the Field

At Crater of Diamonds State Park in Arkansas, people pay \$8 and search for diamonds. Every year, about 200,000 people pour into the park to seek out precious stones. From 2007 to 2009, nearly one diamond was discovered every day.



Diamonds were first discovered at Murfreesboro, Ark., when John Wesley Huddleston found "a glittering pebble" on his land. After a series of ill-fated diamond mining ventures, the State of Arkansas purchased Huddleston's former property in 1972 and established Crater of Diamonds State Park. It is the only diamond-producing site in the world open to the public.

Visitors may search over a 37.5-acre plowed field, which is the eroded

surface of an ancient volcanic crater that brought to the surface the diamonds and some of the semi-precious stones found there today.
