- The known universe stretches more than 30 billion light years (200 sextillion miles), but God measures it by the width of his hand (Isaiah 40:12 NIV)).
- Scientists claim there are at least 100 billion galaxies and each galaxy is made up of about 100 billion stars. To such mind-boggling math, Isaiah reminds us that God calls each star "by name" (Isaiah 40: 26 NIV)).

Comforting? Well, it should be.

If God can hold the waters of the ocean in the hollow of His hand, consider the weight of the Earth as but dust, measure the width of the universe with the span of His hand and call each star by name, surely He can handle the details and dramas of our lives.

The incredible reality to consider is this: The Lord – creator of this vast universe, the world and all that is in it, including humankind, and the giver of all good things – wants to have an intimate relationship with each of us.

He not only gives us the privilege of approaching His throne of love, grace and mercy, but He encourages it. He desires that we bring to Him our petitions and our praise.

What an awesome God He is!

Whatever may be going on around us in this world or in our personal lives, we can take stock in the fact that our Lord is in charge.
