GOLD IN NEVADA

In the 1980s, Northern Nevada was the site of a gold strike. The discovery would have been beyond the imagination of 19th Century prospectors, for the gold in those western hills is virtually invisible.

Even after being magnified 1,500 times, most of the particles remain imperceptible. Modern technology, however, has found a way to extract the gold.

First, tons of ore are crushed to the consistency of fine sand. Then cyanide is added to dissolve the granules into a clear solution. When zinc dust is blended in, the gold separates from the mixture. The gold was there all the time, but it couldn't be seen.
