Let's face it: the world we live in is not focused on heaven, writes Dr. David Jeremiah, senior pastor of Shadow Mountain Community Church in El Cajon, California, in his book *Turning Points*.

"Atheists, agnostics and pagans aren't concerned with heaven at all, and we can understand their inattention. The surprising reality is that many Christians hardly give heaven a second thought either. We live as if this world is the real thing, that which defines who and what we are.

"In fact, just the opposite is true," Dr. Jeremiah continued. "The world is a very

While on earth, the way we keep our eyes focused on heaven is to live in the presence of God through continual worship and communion with Him. Though the media are full of news, don't let it distract you from the good news of the gospel."
