- Credit: Are you quick to recognize others for their efforts when you succeed?
- *Character:* Do you work harder at your image or your integrity?
- Credibility: Have you recognized that credibility is a victory, not a gift?

These are important considerations as we focus on the commitments to residents as our highest priority and to our associates as our most important resource in delivering their care, acknowledging the role God has allowed us to play within that awesome mission.
