As you recall, we have featured some states with these funny ordinances a couple of times before, but let's look at some more. We picked these up from the website of Radio Station WBAC in Cleveland.

In Pocatello, Idaho, pedestrians and motorists are prohibited from displaying frowns, grimaces, scowls, threatening and glowering looks, gloomy and depressed facial appearances, "generally all of which reflect unfavorably upon the city's reputation." It sounds like a great way to deal with road rage, huh? Also in Pocatello, boxes of candy given as romantic gifts must weigh more than 50 pounds. That is a lot of chocolate!

In Indiana, monkeys are forbidden to smoke cigarettes in South Bend. In Gary, it is illegal to attend a theater within four hours of eating garlic. I would vote for that one.

In Kansas, it is illegal for restaurants to sell cherry pie a la mode on Sundays. In Wichita, a man's mistreatment of his mother-in-law may not be used as grounds for divorce. In Lang, it is illegal to ride a mule down Main Street in August, unless the animal is wearing a straw hat. In Natoma, it is illegal to throw a knife at anyone wearing a striped shirt (maybe that was legislation obtained by sports referees).
