Helen Karamanos is one great lady. She first became involved with Rivergate Terrace in Riverview, Michigan, in 1993 when a relative was admitted to the Alzheimer's unit. She began making daily visits to help enrich the lives of the residents.

Several years later, Karamanos and another resident representative developed a family council that depended on the local ombudsman, advocacy groups and others to provide an educational forum to increase understanding of nursing home operations and expectations. Today, the family council has developed into a learning forum, with facility team members providing educational support. To keep the group active, Karamanos has instituted programs to encourage family members' involvement in the care and happiness of the residents.
