Witnesses to the daredevil rides, watching from the trains that replicate the 1961 Cadillac DeVille, notice that some people are riding, screaming, with their heads in their hands and eyes tightly shut. They're afraid to see what's coming next.



At the same time, they notice others on the same ride enduring the same lifts, sharp turns, and 70-degree drops, but with their hands in the air, eyes wide open, and screaming with a confidence that seems almost reckless. Their attitude is one of confidence; they're saying, "Bring it on!" Or, in the vernacular of today, they've "got swagger."

Life is so much like a roller-coaster ride. It may start slowly, steadily speed up, encounter abrupt turns and sudden sharp falls, followed by much higher climbs and even steeper falls. But just as we should expect ups and down from a roller-coaster ride, we should assume the same in life.
