The Bible Says It, You Can Believe It

- Christ would heal the blind and the deaf (Isaiah 29:17-19).
- Christ would present Himself as Messiah by humbly riding into Jerusalem on a donkey (Zechariah 9:9).
- Christ would be betrayed for 30 pieces of silver (Zechariah 11:12-13).
- Christ would be unfairly judged and condemned to die (Isaiah 53:8-9).
- Christ would be abandoned by His disciples (Zechariah 13:7-9).
- Christ would be rejected by His own people (Isaiah 53:3).
- Christ would be crucified (Psalm 22:11-16) as an offering for our sins (Isaiah 53:4-6).
- Christ would rise from the dead (Isaiah 53:10-12).
- Christ, although a Jew, would become a light to the Gentiles and bring salvation to the whole world (Isaiah 49:5-6).

How do these fulfilled prophecies offer us a greater assurance that heaven is real? It's simple. Because the Bible has so accurately revealed detailed events that would happen here on earth, we have every reason to believe that the many details it forecasts about heaven will likewise come to pass.

So don't let your heart be bothered by doubts. Instead, allow the loving promises of God to be your confidence, bringing you hope and encouragement in a fallen and troubled world.

We should, indeed, be celebrating the birth of Jesus Christ!
