Sir Ernest Henry Shackleton (1874 – 1922), was a polar explorer who led three British expeditions to the Antarctic, and one of the principal figures of the period known as the Heroic Age of Antarctic Exploration.

While on one of his expeditions to the Antarctic, Shackleton was once compelled to leave some of his men on Elephant Island, with the intention of returning for them and carrying them back to England. But he was unavoidably delayed, and by the time he could go for them, he found to his dismay that the sea had frozen over and his men were cut off.

Three times he tried to reach them, but his efforts ended in failure. Finally, in his last effort, he found a narrow channel through the ice.

Guiding his small ship back to the island, he was delighted to find his men not only alive and well, but all prepared to get aboard. They were soon on their way to safety and home.

After the excitement ended, Shackleton inquired how it was that they were ready to get aboard so promptly. They told him that every morning, their leader rolled up his sleeping bag, saying, "Get your things ready, boys, the boss may come today."
