The Mine that Keeps Giving


A story on *Fox News* reported that a mine in Australia has produced what its owner believes are two of the biggest gold specimens in recorded history.

The biggest of the stones came in at 198 pounds and is estimated by the company to contain about 143 pounds of gold – a total that at current prices would be worth around \$2.6 million.

The second-biggest piece weighed 132 pounds and was valued at about \$1.95 million.

Early estimates from RNC Minerals have put the total take of coarse gold from the cut at more than 562 pounds, worth more than \$10.4 million.

Airlog driller Henry Dole has been credited with uncovering the astonishing find at the 45-year-old Beta Hunt gold mine near Kambalda.
